Brief description of offense and prisoner's role in it.

I'm convicted of what's said to have been retaliation of a theft of drugs (cocaine) from one of my street level drug dealers. It's said that I was the orchestrator of the retaliation, as well as the actual murderer. However despite the fact that there was never any physical evidence linking me to the crimes, and the surviving victim never identifying me, and testifying that there were at least three men involved in the actual robbery and murder I'm the only person to be charged!

What difficulties have you experienced as a juvenile living among adult prisoners?

At the time of my incarceration I wasn't a juvenile.

Have you been negatively affected by your experiences as a juvenile living among adult prisoners? Please explain.

My experiences in prison have been what a innocent man serving multiple life sentences would expect.

How has a life of incarceration changed you?

My incarceration has obviously taught me patience and appreciation. Since my incarceration my changes have been too numerous to list. The most important change has been my appreciation for life and those whom I love and care for.

Have you remained in continual contact with family or friends since becoming incarcerated?

Yes, I still have contact with my immediate family, and a couple aunts, as well as my children, and my junior high school girlfriend.

If you were granted a second chance and released, what would you do?

If given a 2nd chance at life, I plan on starting a publishing company so that I can publish my own novels as well as those of people in my current situation. I also have an insatiable desire to start a magazine.

Accomplishments/Achievements since you've been incarcerated.

Since I've been incarcerated my accomplishments are but aren't limited to, obtaining my GED, completing a Visual Graphic Arts course, as well as a Business Education Technology course, and I've written three novels. And last but not least, I've learned to be a better parent to my children.

My conduct in prison has not always been as good as it is now. However my worst misconduct was being caught with a substantial amount of marijuana (a quarter pound) in my cell. For this ticket I spent nearly five years in maximum security.
