Yes, my family is in contact with me. But friends turn their back on me a long time ago. It's painful but that sometimes life.

If you were granted a second chance and released, what would you do?

Get two jobs, work real hard and give back to my community the right way. I also would help juveniles who are in the same situation I'm in now.

Accomplishments/Achievements since you've been incarcerated.

My goals are to be major misconduct free, try to learn as much as possible in school, not seeing everyone as a bad person specially adults no matter what situations may come cause we see all humans on God earth. Help other juveniles deal with this situation along with other problems life brings us.

I'd like to prove my innocence along with any others who are truly innocent on the charges we are convicted on. I'd like to help my family deal with the pain of me being wrongfully convicted along with other families. And I'll just keep smiling no matter what.
